Note on the J-1 Visa - Foreign Residency Requirement

A Fulbright grantee must travel to the U.S. on a Fulbright sponsored J-1 visa. The J-visa is for educational and cultural exchange programs designated by the U.S. Department of State. All J-exchange visitors, including J-2 dependents (family members), who participate in programs that are financed in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, by an agency of the U.S. Government or by the exchange visitor's government, are subject to the Foreign Residency Requirement (also called the two-year home residency requirement). All Fulbright grantees and their family members are expected to return to their home countries for at least two years at the conclusion of their grant/degree, in compliance with J-visa requirements.
